SUPPLIER ADHERENCE TO OUR VALUES

To ensure all those in our supply chain and contractors comply with our values we have in place a supply chain compliance programme. This consists of:

- Requesting information from bidders about their Modern Slavery Statement and other ethical and environmental measures taken to ensure supply chains are legally compliant and slavery free; and
- Where appropriate, seek to impose that in new contracts that the Trust enters into provisions for termination in the event of a modern slavery or human trafficking compliance breach by the supplier
- Working with Churchmarketplace to ensure all of our tenders and OEJU contracts meet the requirements of the Modern Slavery Act 2015.

TRAINING

To ensure a high level of understanding of the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking in our supply chains and our organisation, we provide training to our staff.

OUR EFFECTIVENESS IN COMBATING SLAVERY AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING

We use the following indicators to measure how effective we have been to ensure that slavery and human trafficking is not taking place in any part of our business or supply chains:

- no reports are received from employees, the public, or law enforcement agencies to indicate that modern slavery practices have been identified.
